Pupils with chronic pathologies (diabetes, food allergies, etc.) benefit from an Individualised Support Plan (PAI) established by the school doctor.**
6. Do you have any students with learning disorders?[dyslexia, dyscalculia...]? How many? How do you help them? **The Personalized Accompaniment Plan is requested by the families and/or the educationa**

team with the support of a speech therapy and often neuropsychological examination. It is submitted to the school doctor for approval and drawn up by the educational team and the family. If the adjustments are not sufficient, then the family can apply to the Maison Départementale du Handicap (MDPH) for more extensive assistance (such as the assistance of an AESH (Accompagnant des Elèves en Situation de Handicap)). Pupils with dyslexia can have access to a computer for lessons, documents written in Arial 14 and spaced out, photocopied lessons, .. Or, if the MDPH considers it necessary, an AESH for certain courses. At the examination they can benefit from a third time.

7. Do you have any behavioral problems at school? What sort of problems? [drugs, smoking, truancy, bullying...] How do you deal with it?

We have problems with drug abuse, bullying and absenteeism. Absenteeism can be due to drug problems bullying and social difficulties encountered by our students.

We have a principal education advisor, a school nurse, a social worker and a school psychologist in the school to whom we can refer our students.

These professionals are few in number and many young people have difficulties.

In our special care classes, this concerns 5 out of 45 students.

Number of students who study nursing fields:

- 264 students study PRACTICAL NURSE, everyday a four- year course, age of students 15 -19.
- 65 students study REGISTERED NURSE, everyday a three-year course, age of students is over 20

How many students with different nationalities study nursing fields?

Out of 264 students studying daily Practical Nurse 3 students are of a different nationality. They are Ukrainians.

Out of 65 students studying Registered Nurse 3 are Ukrainians.

How do you deal with language barriers?

Ukrainians arrived in spring and summer 2022 without any knowledge of Czech. They passed the exam to enter our school in Russian. In September we had a great difficulty to communicate to them. Even though they have extra Czech lessons, they still do not understand properly and they are not able to speak. It creates a problem especially during practical training. Some of them suffer from depression and need a psychological help.

How do you deal with culture differences and mutual prejudice?

Although we do not have students with different nationalities that much, we sometimes have a foreign student for a year as a part of international projects. These students came from Brazil or the USA. We also enable foreign students a short term hospital training. These students come from Poland, Turkey, Spain and Germany. We always discuss cultural differences with our students beforehand to make sure there is not any misunderstanding.

As far as students from Ukraine, our students are in most cases sympathetic to them.

Do you have any students with physical disabilities? How many? Specify disabilities. How do you help them?

We do not have any students with physical disabilities since it is a necessary requirement for being admitted to study PRACTICAL NURSE.

Do you have any students with learning disorders?[dyslexia, dyscalculia...]? How many? How do you help them?

Out of the 264 students studying PRACTICAL NURSE 23 have some learning disorders.

Types of disorders:

- Dyslexia, dysorthographia – 8 students
- Dyslexia, dysorthographia, dysgraphia – 2 student
- Dysorthographia – 2 student
- Dysgraphia - 2 student
- Dyslexia, dysgraphia – 2 student
- Poor ability to concentrate – 1 student
- Dysgraphia, disorder of motor-visual coordination – 1 student
- Dyslexia, anxiety – 1 student
- Dyscalculia - 2 students
- Expressive dysphasia, ADHD, dyslexia, dysorthographia – 1 student
- Dyslexia, dysorthographia, poor concentration – 1 student

There is a counselor at each school in the Czech Republic who helps students with these disorders. Moreover they all need to have a medical opinion. On the basis of the medical report teachers are obliged to adjust their demands. Even the state final exam at the end of their studies is modified accordingly.

Do you have any behavioral problems at school? What sort of problems? [drugs, smoking, truancy, bullying...] How do you deal with it?

The most common problem is smoking. It is strictly forbidden on all school premises. Nevertheless, students sometimes tend to break the rule and smoke somewhere near the school. They are punished and offered a course how to quit smoking.

The teachers can use alcohol testers if they have suspicion that a student is under the influence of alcohol.

If there is a suspicion of bullying at school, we always cooperate with the school psychologist and the police.

In our school there is a person responsible for prevention of drug usage, smoking and inappropriate behavior. She organizes a variety of preventive activities. Also the school psychologist is employed here.

- In the lessons, topics around prejudice and multicultural society are discussed in the lessons communication skills, ethics.
- Also on internship students come into contact with other cultures / nationalities

- Currently we have 1 student with hearing problems. She receives support from an interpreter during the theoretical lessons.

Do you have any students with learning disorders?[dyslexia, dyscalculia...]? How many? How do you help them?

- All students are entitled to a number of facilities regardless of whether there are learning disabilities.
 - o Use of calculators, calculator
 - o Use of word care cards
 - o Right to have the questions of tests read aloud
 - o Courses available online, powerpoint available online
 - o Each student receives individual guidance from an assigning teacher
 - o Sessions learning to learn / study methodology and fear of failure

- Students with learning disabilities are given a number of facilities:
 - o Oral explanation
 - o Translation dictionary
 - o Optionally print keys at a larger size

Do you have any **behavioral problems** at school? What sort of problems? [drugs, smoking, truancy, bullying...] How do you deal with it?

The students are 18+ so the rules are a bit different.

In case of problems, an initial care is done by the assigning teacher, klas teacher, coordination.

There is a working group crisis team that can possibly provide first aid to students with suicidal thoughts or that can assist teachers with advice and deeds.

Smoking is not allowed inside the school

Drugs: few problems around. If there are problems with this, a guidance plan is drawn up and referred to professional help.

Truancy: the students are 18+. Attendances are recorded daily. If we notice that there are a lot of absences, the students will be addressed around the reason. If absences are not justified, a deregistration can be made.

Bullying: with our group of students (18+) this is not a problem

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
